

DEXTER DAZE COVID PLAN 2021

What Covid protocols will be in place?

- All vendors and Participants will be required to wear a mask and/or follow the current Executive order. This is an outside event so mask will need to be worn if you cannot properly remain socially distant to those around you, when in passing or shopping at a vendor's booth.
- We will ensure there is over 6ft spacing for all vendor booths and children's activities.
- Children's activities will be those that can be singular and/or sanitized between participants.
- We will provide additional handwashing stations and/or hand sanitizing stations throughout the festival at typical entry/exit points, attractions, games, food and beverage concessions, and outside restrooms.
- We will establish a pedestrian traffic flow plan to reduce bottlenecks and ensure the ability to maintain social distancing.
- We will have signage throughout the grounds with the Covid safety outlines and reminders and we will communicate all Covid safety plans on social platforms.

GENERAL PRINCIPALS FOR ATTENDING DEXTER DAZE:

We have taken enhanced health and safety measures for our guests and volunteers.

You must follow all posted instruction while visiting the festival. An inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19 exists in ANY public place where people are present. COVID-19 is an extremely contagious disease that can lead to sever illness and death.

According to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, senior citizens and guests with underlying medical conditions are especially vulnerable. By visiting the Festival, you voluntarily assume all risks related to the exposure of COVID-19.

- If you are sick with COVID-19, recently exposed (within 14 days) to someone with COVID-19, or just do not feel well, you should not visit the festival.
- Anyone who is in a high-risk category, as defined by the CDC, should not visit the festival.
- All guests and volunteers shall wear a cloth face covering in public areas as outlined by the CDC and the State of Michigan's current Executive Order if you are unable to properly social distance at the festival.
- All guests and volunteers shall practice social distancing protocols in public areas per State regulations while at the festival.
